


Priority Areas FY2016-17

- 1. Actions that will facilitate adoption and implementation of the EDRR Framework at the local, regional and Federal levels.
- 2. Analysis of the impact of Federal authorities relevant to the effective implementation of E.O. 13112.
- 3. Evaluation of the value of conducting national assessments, including socio-economic analysis, on cross-cutting invasive species issues to link science with decision-making.
- 4. Development of a communication strategy to strengthen the NISC's outreach efforts.
- 5. Ways to promote regional coordination and cooperation on invasive species at the landscape level.
