Wood Packaging Material (WPM)

- The import regulation for WPM has been in effect since 2005
- It states that WPM must be treated and properly marked
- Ports of Entry are still encountering non-compliant WPM in large numbers
- The majority of non-compliance stems from WPM missing the required markings or marked with faulty stamps.



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Penalties

- Effective **November 1, 2017**, WPM penalties are effective can be issued for a first time violation
- Eliminating the five violation allowance will:
 - Align this process with other CBP enforcement actions
 - Prompt compliance
- All other WPM policies, exemptions, and exceptions stand as previously



National Maritime Dunnage Policy

- Effective **November 1, 2017**, USDA Animal Plant and Health Inspection Services (APHIS) are allowing incineration as a secure disposal option for violate dunnage
- This is available for maritime cargo at U.S. Seaports if there is access to an APHIS-approved incineration facility
- Compliance agreements must be in place for secure disposal of maritime dunnage

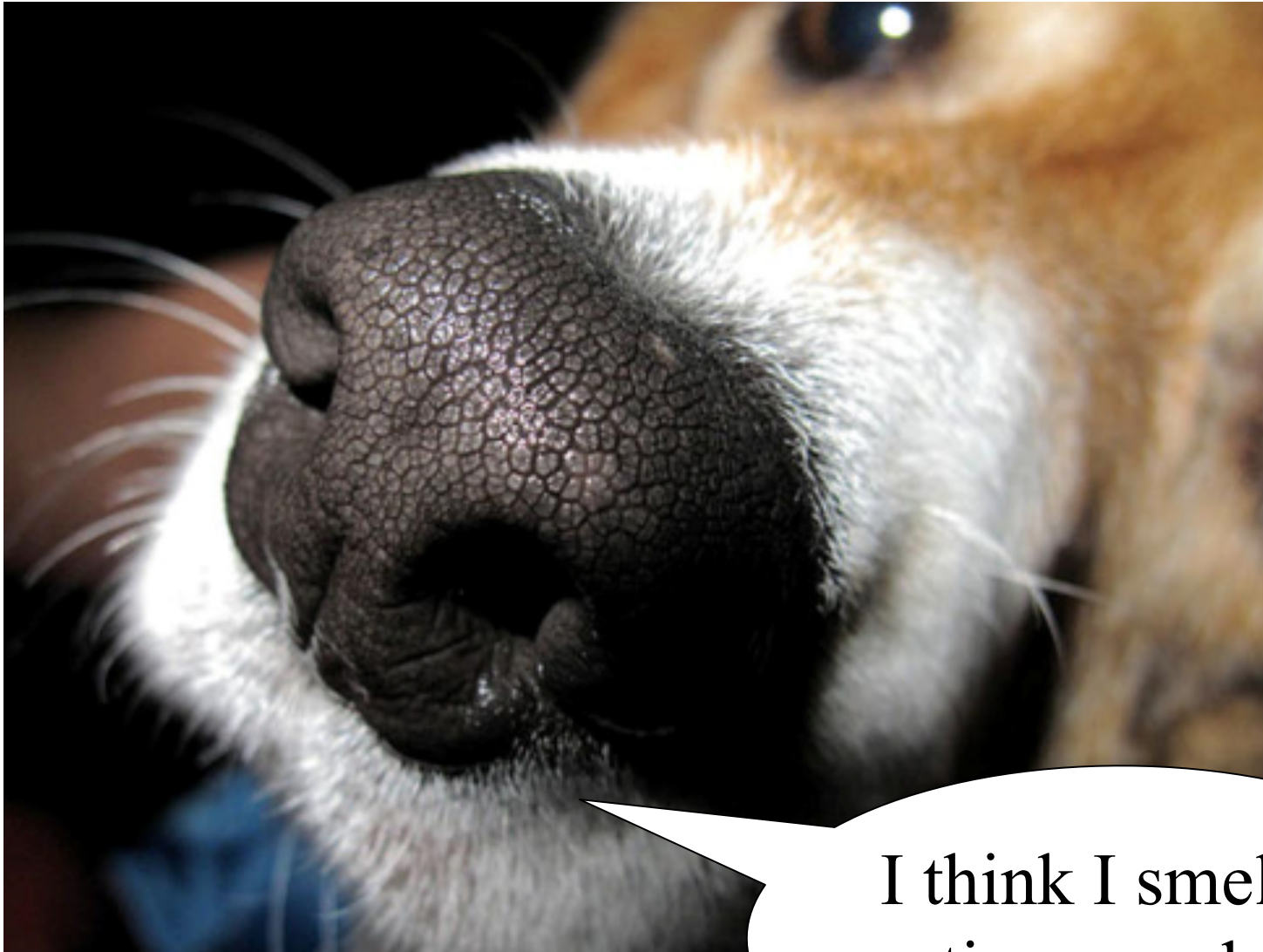
